depth_analysis_of_infants_born_between_january_2015_and_dec ember_2017.pdf) report provides key information on infant feeding practices. Oxford County breastfeeding rates compare favourably with the provincial rate but there are still areas which could improve with interventions.

Smoking Cessation

Stop smoking workshops are held monthly to support residents ready to quit. Workshops are 1.5 hours and participants receive 5 weeks of free nicotine replacement therapy (e.g., patches, gum, lozenges, quickmist, inhaler).
