

"Methadone may cover the withdrawal, but for people like me that are intravenous users, you are also addicted to that ritual.
So it's only half the battle."

"I have no pain management to deal with it and no one should have to go without sleep for three days."

"I called and I was pretty much signed up to go to a medical detox and then the doctor at work wouldn't let me do it."

"I'm at the point now where I'm just waiting to find out if my son ends up dead."
